COL students will demonstrate college level reading ability at the time of graduation. <i>(student achievement)</i>  <b>Indicator of Progress:</b> <i>Annually, at high school graduation, 90% or more of COL graduates will demonstrate college level reading ability in one of the following ways:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Achieve scores of 83 or higher on the College Placement Test (CPT) in the areas of reading and sentence skills <u>or</u></i></li> <li>• <i>Earn a score higher than 440 on the SAT critical reading or a score of 18 on the ACT reading. (Note: A score of 83 on the CPT is the cut score for taking college credit courses. The ACT/SAT scores listed above are College Board Equivalency scores with CPT.)</i></li> </ul>	<p>Goal Met            97% (115 of 118 graduates demonstrated college level readiness for reading)</p>
<p>5. COL students will demonstrate college level mathematics ability upon high school graduation. <i>(student achievement)</i>  <b>Indicator of Progress:</b> <i>Annually, at high school graduation, 85% or more of COL students will demonstrate college level math ability in one of the following ways:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Achieve a score of 72 or higher on the math portion of the College Placement Test <u>or</u></i></li> <li>• <i>Earn a score higher than 440 on the SAT math or a score of 19 on the ACT math. (Note: A score of 72 on the CPT was the cut score for taking college credit courses for students admitted to COL through August 2008. The ACT/SAT scores listed above are College Board equivalency scores with the CPT for math.)</i></li> </ul>	<p>Goal Met            91% (107 of 118 graduates demonstrated college level readiness for math)</p>
<p>6. COL students will show mastery of science Sunshine State Standards through FCAT. <i>(student achievement)</i>  <b>Indicator of Progress:</b> <i>Annually, COL will meet or exceed the percentage of students scoring 3 or higher on FCAT science in comparable schools as determined by the Florida Department of Education.</i></p>	<p>Goal Met            COL = highest scores in district; &gt;all comparable schools)</p>

COL will operate with sound financial principles. <i>(quality school climate)</i>  <b>Indicator of Progress:</b> <i>COL will have an unreserved/ unrestricted operating fund balance of 5% of annual revenue as evidenced on annual financial audit.</i></p>	<p>Goal Met  \$704,762 - fund balance exceeds 5% minimum</p>

COL will have an active and supportive board of directors. <i>(quality school climate)</i>  <b>Indicator of Progress:</b> <i>The seven-member board of directors will hold a minimum of four meetings each year (with a quorum of 4 or more in attendance) as evidenced from minutes from those board meetings. PSC COL stakeholders will reflect their satisfaction with the overall school program. <i>(quality school climate)</i>  <b>Indicators of Progress:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>The average response of parents will be 1.0 or higher (on a scale of -2 - +2) on at least 6 (86%) of the effective school correlates on the Annual Climate Survey.</i></li> <li>• <i>The average response of students will be 1.0 or higher (on a scale of -2 - +2) on at least 6 (86%) of the effective school correlates on the Annual Climate Survey.</i></li> </ul>	<p>Goal Met  Average response of both groups = 1.0 or higher on 100% of the correlates.</p>
